




Converting ebooks to use within a VLE

This guide will show you how to convert your ebooks so that you can put them in your VLE. You could upload them just as a pdf, but by doing this, the children would be able to download them and use them elsewhere, possibly breaking your license. Please check your license before following this guide. The e-books provided free at TeachMeet East give you the ability to upload them to a VLE.

To do this you will need an account from one of the following services: Google, Twitter, Wordpress, Yaaoo or AOL. These are all free to sign-up to. Google is probably the easiest, visit www.google.co.uk and click 'sign-in' in the top-right hand corner, then 'Create an account'.


<p>Visit the embedit.in website: http://www.embedit.in</p>	
<p>Press Select Files and find your pdf ebook. Please note, this will not work if you have e-books in other formats such as Microsoft Reader.</p>	
<p>Sign-in using your account from one of these services.</p>	

On this page, you can edit your book. Change the width to 500-700 and the height to 650.

To comply with your license, I suggest you turn off the print, download and public settings.

As you make changes, the page will update so you can see how it looks before you embed it.

Once finished, copy the code in the 'Embed Code' box (arrowed)

You can embed the embed code in any website (but make sure you check the licence for your e-books) but to embed them into the Norfolk Primary VLE:-

Log in your VLE and choose 'Create a new property' from the property menu.

Select 'DIY' Property

Give it a name, and fill in all the usual details!

Click to set your sharing permissions if needed.

When the editor appears- click on the button that says HTML and paste in the embed code from embedit.in. If you want to add any text (perhaps questions etc) then you can do this here too!

Click save- and your property will be created

Click 'add to class' and select which classes you wish to add the e-book too!

You should also be able to add the e-book to E-learning Folios on the VLE.
